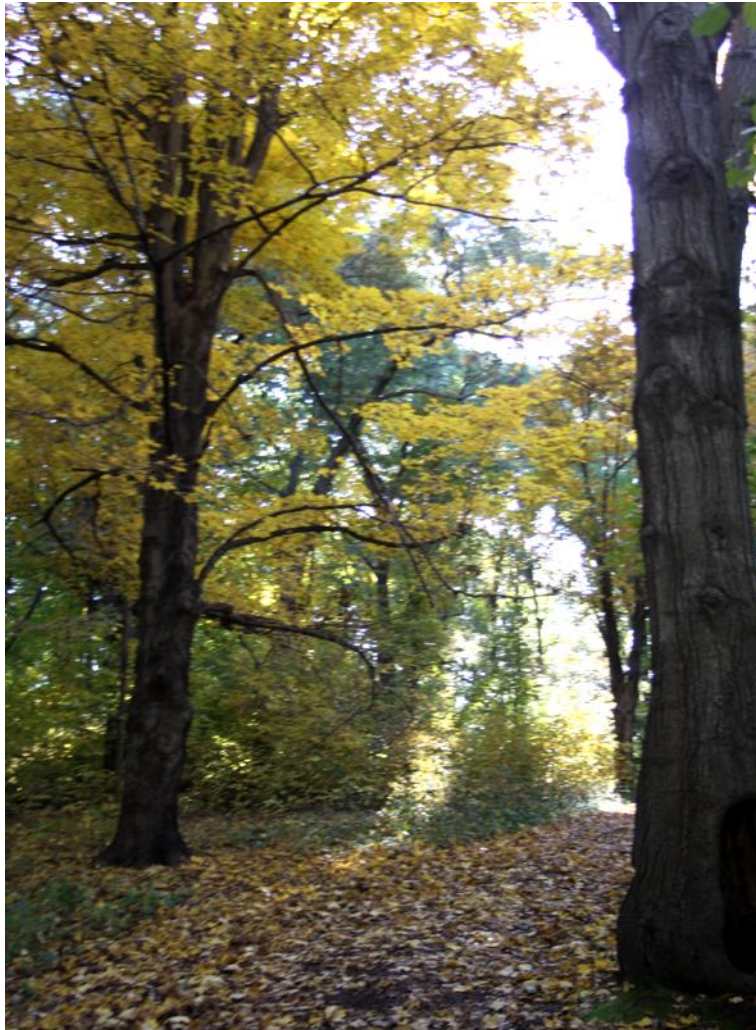

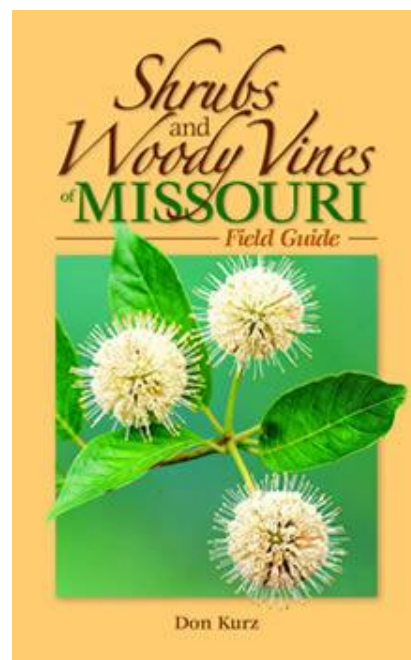
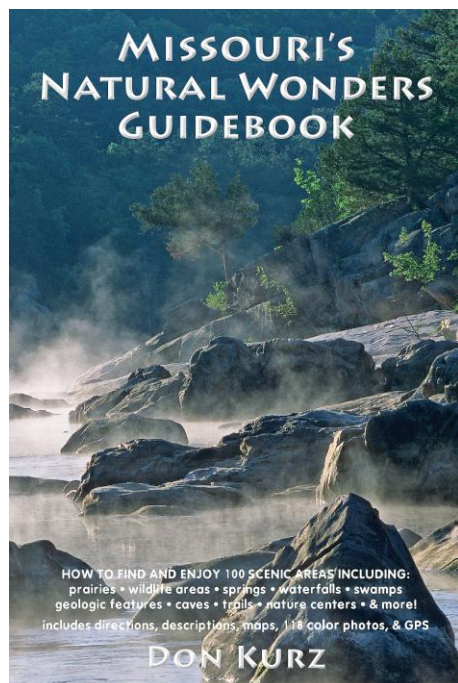
NEW BOOKS

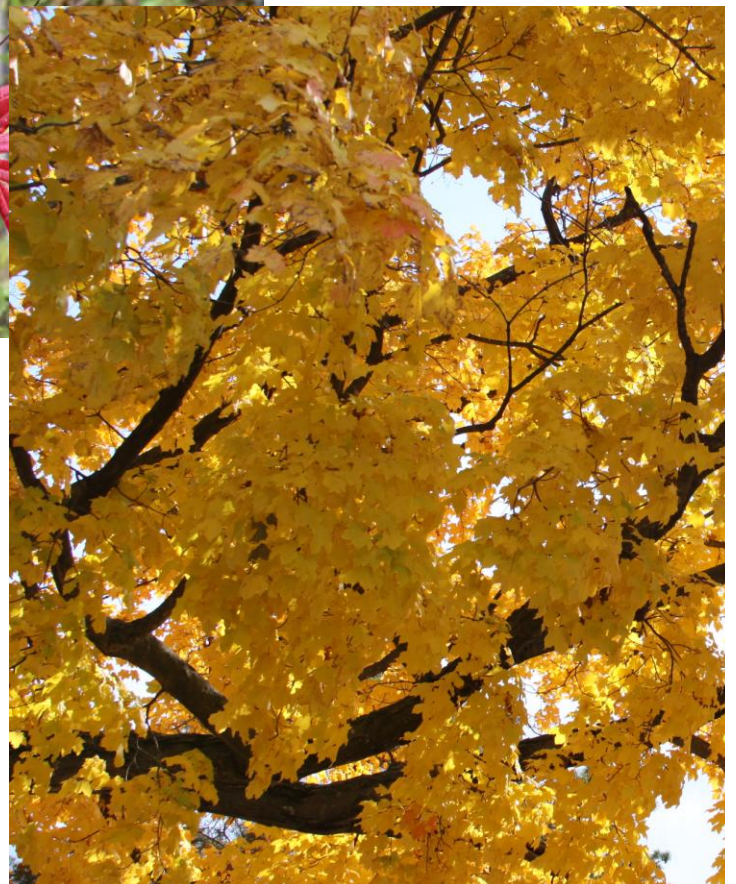
